APOGEE ADVENTURES 2025 Alps Explorer Summarized Itinerary

Trip Begins: Geneva, Switzerland **Trip Ends:** Geneva, Switzerland

Days 1-3: Arriving into Geneva's International Airport, we will gather our gear and make our way to

the in-airport train station, where we will transfer directly into the heart of the Alps and the mountain town of Zermatt. Zermatt is in the heart of Switzerland's picturesque Valais region, and it will serve as the perfect base as we get to know one another and start our hiking adventure in the shadow of the world-famous Matterhorn. Climbing out of the valley and up above tree line, we will feel the burn of a tough climb, but be more than adequately rewarded by cool Alpine air and striking views of the Matterhorn and neighboring peaks.

Day 4: On the morning of Day 4, we will transfer by train to the Swiss city of Martigny, the cultural

capital of the Valais region, where we will take a day to catch our breath, get provisioned

and geared-up for the days to come, and explore the vibrant streets.

Days 5-9: Well-provisioned, we will set off on the full, 110-mile *Tour du Mont Blanc*. Climbing out of

Switzerland, we will travel ancient footpaths through quiet valleys, climb high mountain passes, absorb seemingly unending Alpine vistas, and hike over the border into France. We will enjoy our first indoor stay in a French *refuge*, complete with a homemade three-course meal, before we make our way to the hustle and bustle of the resort town of Chamonix. With each day offering more breathtaking views, we will continue over the high pass into

Italy and the small hikers' town of Courmayeur.

Days 10-12: In Courmayeur, we will enjoy two well-deserved days off, highlighted by authentic Italian

gelato and an epic cable car trip to Punta Helbronner at nearly 3,500 meters to experience 360° views of Mont Blanc, Aiguille du Midi, Grandes Jorasses, and the rest of the Alps.

Days 13-15: After sampling plenty of the local cuisine (see: pizza), we will hit the trail again en route to

our next indoor stay at an Italian *rifugio* overlooking the thousand-year-old Prè de Bard glacier. Finally, we will cross back into Switzerland, relishing the last leg of our trek.

Days 16 & 17: Upon completion of the Tour du Mont Blanc, we will make our way to the historic and

beautiful city of Geneva. The famous, high-shooting "Jet d'Eau" water fountain will punctuate our celebration (as will one final gelato) as we explore the city and reflect on the

many highlights of our unforgettable journey.

Please note that we often run Alps Explorer with two groups in the field concurrently, an "A" and "B" group. Both groups will include very similar activities but might be in a different order. Students will be placed into groups and will receive their night-by-night itinerary a few weeks before the trip begins. All itineraries are subject to change.
